Instead of getting the Spokes mailed to your house, you receive an Email Notification with the link to get your copy. The largest single cost to the dub is the printing and mailing of our newsletter, with it being over \$4,500 per year to do so. The newsletter is already published on our website and if half of the current membership volunteers to opt-out of getting a hard copy of the Spokes, we could easily balance our books and get off this "austerity" budget. Currently we have 24 out of 165 members that have signed up for this new program from last month's meeting but we do need more people to sign up.





Father's Day In Cazenovia The Central NY MGCC Car Show On the Green

On Sunday June 17, Father's Day, some from our club went to the Central NY MGCC car show in Cazenovia, NY. The Jacks (TR-6) Paulsens (TR-3), Powers

(Alfa) and Tesciones

had perfect weather to travel to the Lorenzo State Historic Site, the location for the show. This location is home to the Lorenzo mansion and has a sloping green that overlooks Cazenovia Lake. The mansion and its gardens were open to the public and the view of the cars with the lake in the background was exquisite.

The featured car of the show was Fiat and many old and new were there. Two that are rarely seen are the Abarth "Double Bubble" coupe and the Fiat 8V. I have seen a few of the Abarth coupes and an SCCA friend raced a 750 SS version. The 8V or "Otto Vu" in Italian, is a very different story. Only 114 were made from 1952 to 1954 and the name 8V was used because Fiat thought Ford had trademarked "V8". The car did well in racing, but wasn't a commercial success. The owner of 8V also brought along his Blower Bentley!







The show had 200+ cars with a good showing of MGB models, but only a few T series. One MG surprise was the number of MGAs. There were 14, (*yes 14*) and that included a MkII Deluxe and a Twin Cam! I can't remember seeing that many MGAs in one place other than at NAMGAR events.

They use participant judging at this show and Ned Paulsen took a 3rd with his TR-3.

Many of us are already planning on coming back next year as the setting is spectacular, with great cars and good *Safety Fast Fun* with our friends in the Central NY MGCC.



Bury Me in an Old Mowog Parts Box

The other day the postman brought an interesting envelope from Joe and Sally Genco. Inside was a fascinating article from the New York Times about automobiles that famous individuals own.

Most are aware. for example. that Jay Leno is an avid enthusiast owning 60 automobiles and 58 motorcycles.(He should know Brian Neri) For example he has several Duesenbergs, along with a Morgan three wheeler: The article brings mention that Ralph Lauren. the fashion designer, has several Ferraris and a Mercedes Benz SSK. which has been shown at Pebble Beach. (the ex Count Trossi Mercedes named after its original owner.) He also owns one of the rare (two built) Bugatti Atlantic Electron Coupes. Which of these he wound up with I am not aware of. but one of these cars (ex Lord Rothschild) was or is owned by Dr. Peter Williamson a neurologist from Connecticut who had or has a whole bevy of Bugattis. I once had a quick two minute conversation with Dr. Williamson telling him I had admired his Type 35B the evening before. I also complimented him on his purchase of the Atlantic Electron Coupe that he had purchased just a few months earlier in a three minute auction for \$59.000. This was about 1972 or so so I am not sure if he still owns the car

These are up to date owners and we will get back to them. First lets go back several years and cover a few that were not mentioned in the article.

Remember Clark Gable and Gary Cooper? These two actors were both avid car people but had the famous cars when they were new and used them daily. Cooper had

several Duesenbergs. one of which is a magnificent dual cowl phaeton in the Sandwich Plantation Museum in Sandwich Mass. Gable also had at least two Duesenbergs plus a good number of Packards and such. He had one of the first Jaguar XK 120s in California as well as one of the first Mercedes Benz 300SL Mercedes in California.

Remember Eddie Anderson? Eddie was the gravel voiced butler (Rochester) that was on the Jack Benny show. Eddie had several cars including Ferraris and one car that he had custom built by someone like George Barris. I never did see a picture of this car finished. but I remember a magazine article about its construction years ago. Often wondered whatever happened to it and if it survives. Also wonder what it was based on.

The Today Show back in the 50s was at one time hosted by Dave Garroway. Garroway had and raced in early SCCA events with a SS 1 00 (Jaguar) that was fitted with a later XK 120 engine. From what I understand the car is now in Colorado. Look back through some early SCCA magazines and you will see Garroway and the SS 1 00 in action. I don't know if he was ever successful but he did run it for several seasons.

Morticia on the Adams family at one time t was played by Yovonne DeCarlo. She once had an MG TC but Charles Adams who was the originator was an avid enthusiast. I knew Charles slightly and one time sat next to him at the American Bugatti Club luncheon at LaChanteclair in New York. We had a very interesting chat and at the time he had a Aston Martin LeMans, a Type 35B Bugatti plus a modern Bentley Silver Spur. If you attended the Tour de Project you may have

noticed the original

Charles Adams cartoon on the garage wall and the framed note and photo of his then Mercedes Benz S taken at Watkins Glen in 1948 on the wall in the hallway. Charlie told my dad and I that he was given the Mercedes Benz model S during the war by a friend. The guy was afraid to drive it because it was a German car and we were at war with Germany.

Through the article Sally and Joe sent I discovered that David Letterman owns at least one Ferrari. an early 1951 212 Inter coupe. Not the prettiest Ferrari ever built (that title has to go to the 250 Lusso) but a very rare and interesting car. Clive Cussler, the well known author. owns a Avions Voisin. a Hispano Suiza. an L29 Cord plus several others totaling some 90 automobiles. Can you imagine trying to maintain a collection like this? I have trouble keeping up with two.

One personality that was a real surprise was Nicolas Cage. I have seen him in several movies but had no idea that he was an automobile enthusiast. Mr. Cage has a Lamborghini Miura. a racing D type Jaguar and a Bugarti. probably a Type 50.

We covered only a few of the famous people who have owned great automobiles. There are surely hundreds more. We mentioned Eddie Anderson and Jack Benny but I failed to mention Jack Benny's famous car, his Maxwell.
