

Art With a Heart serves up raftle

CANANDAIGUA - The Canandaigua community is coming together again this year to raise money for its local hospital. Organizations involved are the Canandaigua Merchants Association (CDMA), the Thompson Guild, Finger Lakes Community College and local artists.

"Last year's event with the Adirondack Chairs was such a hit, we wanted to find a way to make it an annual event," said Aimee Ward, president of the CDMA. The downtown merchants are asked by different organizations an year long to give to so many different charities, they wanted to find a way to do something collectively, and have fun with it.

This year the plan was to come up with something smaller than an Adirondack chair. Judi Cermak, president of the Ontario Arts C':JUncil, came up with the serving trays. "They can be useful and beautiful at the same time," said Cermak.

The CDMA has partnered with the Thompson Guild for the second year. Karen Lustick, president of the Thompson Gy.ild, was instrumental in working with the School of the Holy Childhood to come up with the design and affordable costs of the serving trays. The CDMA purchased them, and then put out a call for artists. There were so many local artists who wanted to be involved, that a second order for more trays was needed.

Each hand-painted tray is on display at merchants throughout downtown Canandaigua. Raffle tickets can be purchased at each of the participating merchants for \$1 each or six for \$5. Each tray has a specific "raffle can" so you put your tickets in the can that matches the tray that you want. Winning tickets will be drawn Aug. 31 and winners will be notified then of each tray. Proceeds will be used to purchase specialized computer equipment for' Thompson Health. To view the art online, visit www.Canandaigua Arts.com. There you will find a complete list of merchants and photos of all the artistic serving trays.

A handpainted tray by <u>Peggi Heissenberger</u> is on display at Finger lakes Gallery and Frame in Canandaigua as part of the Art With a Heart community fundraiser. People can purchase raffle tickets for \$1 each or six for \$5; the drawing will be Aug.31.

We finally did it! Three generations of the Langswager family drove MG's to an event.



The American MGC Register held their national meet at Watkins Glen this year,

July 25 –29. Betty & I were asked to be the hosts. It started over a year ago when the chairman, Keith Sanders, asked us about having an event in Watkins Glen. We invited Keith & his wife, Gail, to join us for Vintage Weekend last year. We even invited them to be "Volunteers" at the Downtown Festival. We spent a day touring the area, checking out the various attractions & facilities & started making plans. During the year Betty & I made a few trips to the Glen & came up with a tentative schedule of activities & a place to stay. You'd be surprised how difficult it is to get a block of 25 rooms in a hotel in July. The best I could do at Seneca Lodge was 10. Also, it is tough to get a banquet for 50 people on a Saturday night. Many weddings & other events are going on. Couldn't even do it at the expensive Harbor Hotel. Anyway, we got a commitment from the Villager Inn. Bill Milliken passed away last July, 28th at 101. Possibly you know of him through all he did for racing, especially at the Glen. In 2010, many MGCC members were able to attend his 99th birthday party at the International Motor Racing Research Center. We had a great time with him and he was eager to have a picture taken with the WNYMGCC gang. Even at his 100th birthday celebration, it seemed like he would go on forever, as he enjoyed his cake and ice cream.

Milliken competed in over 100 races including a number at Sebring. At the first Sebring in '50, he and Rochester's Frank O'Hare, raced an **MGTC** and finished 6th overall on index. In '55 he raced a Healey 100M and in '60, his last race, he and Cameron Argetsinger raced Argetsinger's Alfa Giulietta Spider Veloce to 4th in the GT 1300 class.

At the Glen, you may have driven "Milliken's Corner" on the original through-the-streets course. He attained that notoriety by rolling his Type 35A Bugatti during practice for the first Glen races in1948. Milliken's Corner is the left hander after the long downhill Big Bend as you come back into town. I've driven it many times in my MGA and can see why Milliken may have had trouble with that tight corner. You can gain tremendous speed in the Big Bend and 1948 brakes were marginal at best.

In addition to his "corner", Milliken is famous throughout the world for his aeronautical and automotive work. He graduated from MIT in '34 and worked in the aircraft industry for 20 years including work on the XB-29 and B-17. In '44 he was Managing Director of the Cornell Aeronautical Lab and in '48, he was co-inventor of the variable stability aircraft. When he retired, he was head of the Cornell Transportation Research Division.

In the early days of SCCA, he was elected to the first Board of Directors, wrote the first SCCA General Competition Rules and served as Vice President. Along with Argetsinger, he was in the first group elected to the SCCA Hall of Fame. Milliken had a major role in the design of the present Glen circuit and was Chief Steward for the Formula One US GP races at the Glen. He has written many books including: Race Car Vehicle Dynamics and Equations of Motion—Adventure, Risk and Innovation: An Engineering Autobiography.

Bill Milliken is survived by his wife Barbara, son Douglas and daughter Ann.

Bury Me in an Old Mowog Parts Box

The Joy of Owning a Vintage Sports Car Part II

No, I never said there would be a part two and I didn't think there would be either, but there is a part two. Now sit down and be quiet there will be a short quiz after. After the engine was finally back in the car and I had it running I noticed a little clink, clink while the car was running. Ever on the look out I looked around a bit and found that the fan on the water pump was a bit loose. I had had this off and looked at things but never checked the fan on the water pump shaft. I decided to take off the water pump and tighten up the fan. After getting the water pump loose I couldn't get it out of the car so I pulled the radiator off. Removing the water pump is now a simple job. While I had the radiator off I decided to have it looked at in the radiator shop nearby. I have owned the car some 40 years and never had the radiator checked for leaks etc.

The gentleman there was very nice and said he would let it soak overnight and check it tomorrow. This was Thursday so I went home and repaired the water pump. Took out

the split pin, tightened up the nut and presto the water pump was fixed. The radiator shop called the next moming and I went to retrieve the radiator. Looked good and I brought it home and spent most of Saturday trying to get it back on the car. I finally managed but then the hood would not close properly and the radiator cap had a forward slant. Monday I stopped back at the radiator shop and explained my dilemma. I told him when he pressure tested the radiator he blew up the tank like a balloon and now nothing fits properly and the whole front of the car is out of kilter. He said bring it back I can fix that so when I got home I again took off the radiator and in an hour or so I was back at the radiator shop with the radiator, I took an extra old radiator with me that I have to show him where the tank had become enlarged. True to his word he had the radiator done in a few hours and he was really very nice about it. He said he only used about five pounds of pressure to test for leaks but never noticed the expansion of the tank. He said he retested it at around two pounds or so and it already started to

expand again. So he quit and got it back into the proper configuration. Being that it is painted black and is mostly covered by the grill and shell the few small dents are hardly noticeable.

So again I am back in business with a freshly cleaned out radiator and no leaks (He did find three small leaks) But I am here to warn you that these are not pressurized radiators so be careful when you take them some place to be worked on. I never thought about this but two pounds will start expanding the tank. Now think of me.....I had the engine out twice and installed twice, the radiator out four times and back in four times. Let's hope I don't have to do any work on that car for a long time. I've got and old MOWOG parts box out in the garage and my ashes will fill it nicely.
