

My Cars 6 / MG's

I purchased my first MG in January of 1966 and drove that car for almost three years. When I traded it in, I had always planned on buying another one some

time in the future but family and career seem to get in the way. After moving to Massachusetts and going through several jobs, it appeared that I was



never going to be able to get another MG.

Early in 1978, I saw an ad in our company news letter for a 1967 MGBGT Special. This was one of the 1000 first anniversary GT's that they built for 1967. I called the seller right away and set up a time to look at the car. He drove it to work the next day, I drove it at lunch time and agreed to pay him the \$1200 asking price. The following day, I handed him a check and drove the car home that day. This car was defiantly a driven automobile showing the ravages of New Mexico sun, Buffalo and New England winters, and a growing child... but it ran great. This was a good weekend car to drive to the beach and touring around in.

After moving back to New York, the GT again was a good source of weekend and vacation enjoyment. As members of the MG Car Club, we made a number of rallies, tours, and "New England Mountain Adventures" in the GT. Growing older, it was also subject to a number of memorable breakdowns and a growing

rust problem.



Being a member of the club had advantages and the access to more MG's for sale. Since riding in my college room mates TC, I had always liked the openness of the T series MG. When I saw an ad in the Spokes for a reasonably priced "restorable" TD, I just had to

take a look at

This car had not run for at least 10 years so I had to have it transported to the garage I had contracted to do



some preliminary restoration work. After several weeks and hundreds of dollars, I got to drive the car home.

With several short trips around town that first summer, I decided that the car wasn't in as good condition that I had thought. It appeared that a full restoration was needed. I disassembled the car and engine and started getting some work done. At this time, I discovered that the engine was in really bad shape after the last rebuild. This was the year that my son was going away to college so funds became tight and the TD project got put on a back burner for a while.

In the early 90's, yet another T series MG that I was interested in came on the market. This car was owned by Bob Philip and was all apart and stored in his basement. The car was imported in 1966 by former club member John Callahan before Bob purchased it

and started resto-

ration.

I purchased this TA as a future restoration project and again, it was stored in parts in several locations. It took a number of club members to get that car out



through a 36" wide door and into a trailer. Over the past 20 years, I have worked off and on doing the restoration.

Due to some unforeseen career changes consisting of a number of different jobs, a shortage of funds have forced me to change direction on the future of my MG's. I started trying to sell the TD but it was still in pieces so it was hard to market as a complete car. I finally broke down and parted it out to finance the

work on the TA. As of now, all of the large parts of the TD are gone leaving me with enough room in my garage to work on other projects. Now that I am retired, I have spent some time on the TA restoration and it is now a lot closer to being completed than it has been in the last 40 years. With any luck, some time in the near future, this car will again be cruising down the road.

How Long Will It Run? ... the second edition.

A look back into last year's spokes will tell you that a Buick that has **just the oil drained** from it will run for over 2 hours at idle speed. At this year's Car Show, **Wilbert's U-PULL IT** donated a 1998 Dodge NEON for the contest. The car had 157,000 miles showing on the odometer and a 2 liter, 4 cylinder, 16 valve Dodge engine in it.

The Morning of the car show dawned with a strong threat of rain. I figured we need to drain the fluids BEFORE the rain starts in earnest. We jacked up the car onto jack stands, and first drained the Oil. A nice black oil poured from the engine, but there was a full 5 quarts in there because we couldn't put all the old oil into a single one gallon jug. Undaunted we moved to the Radiator next and found it was full of some very nice looking radiator coolant mixture. That was well over a gallon of coolant as well. The excess oil and the excess radiator fluid got mixed into the 3rd gallon jug that I had brought for the used fluids. The bottom line, by 9:00 AM, the car had **NO OIL**, and **NO COOL-ANT** in the system. Just in time, the rain began to fall in earnest.

Now tickets for this event are sold in 15 second blocks. There is a board with 1 hour's worth of blocks on it.... check the math, that is 240 possible 15 second blocks to choose from. To split the 50/50 jackpot with the club, you must purchase the proper time block when the engine will stop running. If the engine stops on a block that has not been purchased, the club keeps 75% and pays out 25% to the next highest time block.

Given the rains, ticket sales were a little slow. But eventually the board began to fill out a bit. Many of the early buyers figured on a short run. I heard all kinds of theories, but I recalled last year's 2 hour marathon and with the cool rainy day, I just felt the betting should be in the bigger numbers.

At just after noon, the rain stopped and the car was started. It started right up and purred like a kitten. The Check engine light and the Oil pressure light were immediately evident. One time block after another fell by the wayside and the frenzy was on to buy the later blocks. With no rain, sales of blocks was brisk for a while, and the engine ran on. Even with the late frenzied buying, we only sold 39% of the possible time blocks this year.

At about 15 minutes into the trial, the Heat gauge was pegged to HOT and the engine smelled of the heat.

Steam curled from the radiator cap and the engine began to shake a little, a sign that things were getting rougher.

At 30 minutes into the run, the steam emitting from the loosened radiator cap was now pouring out. There was no mistaking that this baby was **HOT!** Doug Scribner stood by with a fire extinguisher recalling the grease that caught fire on last year's Buick engine, but only smoke and steam this year, no Fire.

At 38 Minutes the car began to alternately chug then rev on it's own while the electronic engine controls revived it several times before finally, at 38 Minutes and 37 seconds, the engine just stopped.

We checked the board, and sure enough that magical time block had been purchased. The proud winner of \$93.00 was Bob Pethick. Of course the other \$93.00 is now part of this year's Car Show Results. Bob Pethick bought just 2 time blocks and got back over 22 times the money he put in! Nice payday!

I would like to especially thank <u>Wilbert's U-PULL IT</u> for donating the car for this year's contest! By the way, for all you MG enthusiasts, they had just received an MG on **the U-Pull IT** lot the day before our car show. I can't remember if it was a B or a Midget or ???? Please mention you heard about them from our contest and maybe we'll get a car again.

I would also like to thank Preston, Leon's grandson, who helped with the money and the receipts, and to Mike Harrison who helped throughout the contest including the early dirty work with draining fluids, and to my wife Marlene, who helped with signage and arrangements and remembered to go to the bank on Friday to get \$100 worth of small bills to get us started. Marlene also dutifully followed the little purple NEON driving our pick-up truck from the U-PULL IT to the Elk's club as I drove the NEON to the show.




