

First off Congradulations on this award.

SP- What does this award mean to you?

AL- It's such a prestigious honor to be recognized by the drivers.

I never expected it.

It is pretty significant and humbling that my name now appears

with some of the most re-known MG racers around.

SP- When did you start racing?

AL- June 2001.

SP- Where was your first race?

AL- Watkins Glen with Historic Sportscar Racing, which at that time was partnered with SVRA.

AL- For the pure pleasure of showing off the car. The challenge of finishing a race weekend in a car that I built. For the camaraderie of like-minded people on a race weekend. To run on the tracks that I read about in high school.

SP- What is your most memorable race?

AL- That's a tough one. I remember bits of most every race I've run for one outstanding reason or another. In that respect, they are

all memorable. For me it's not so much the racing that stands

out as it is the socializing over the course of the weekend.

SP- What is your favorite track?

AL- So far Watkins Glen.

However, I like Mosport and MidOhio as well. Circuit of the Americas was special as was Indianapolis. There are still tracks I haven't been on and look forward to running in the not too distant future. There are also a few tracks I wouldn't return to.

MGB US 20 Trip Talk

"It reminds us of all that once was good, and it could be again." That quote is from the movie Field of Dreams filmed in Dyersville, Iowa on US Route 20. It applies to so much of Route 20 which is the longest road in the United States. It runs 3,365 miles through big cities, small towns, farmland, deserts and mountains. It also runs through history with many links to Ontario County and the Finger Lakes region.

Last year, new Club members Rob and Carole Lillis drove their 73 MGB the entire length of Route 20 from Boston to Newport, Oregon and then down the California coast. Along the way they visited historic sites and met great people with wonderful stories. Parts of Route 20 follow the Oregon Trail, the California Trail and the Mormon Trail. Freeport, Illinois, on Route 20,

is the site of the famous debate between Abraham Lincoln and Canandaigua Academy alumnus Stephen A. Douglas. Closer to home, route 20 passes through Seneca Falls, home of the Women's Rights National Historical Park on the site of the first Women's Rights Convention held in 1848.

On Wednesday October 15, 2014 at 6:30 at Wood Library on North Main Street Canandaigua, the Ontario County Historical Society is sponsoring a talk about the trip called, "While We Still Can." There is no fee and reservations are not required.

My First Car Part 1

For Father's Day, my daughter and grandson gave me the book:

My First Car by Matt Stone.

Possibly some of you have seen the book, but basically the author interviewed about 80 people who were Racers, in the Auto Industry, Stars of Stage & Screen, Athletes, Journalists and Artists.

As an example: Stirling Moss - '36 Morgan Trike, Steve McQueen - MG TC, Danica Patrick - '96 Ford SVT Mustang Cobra, drummer Neil Peart -'69 MGB, Paul Newman -'29 Ford Model A., Jay Leno -'34 Ford pickup, racer Ryan Newman -'74 TR6, Lyn St James -'65 Pontiac 2+2 421, and Piero Ferrari (son of Enzo) -'63 Morris Mini.

This got me thinking that some folks we know may have had interesting First Car stories. Here are a few examples from our MGCC:

George Haynes

"My first-ever car was a 1931 Model A Ford coupe. I drove it around the empty lot next to our house in Brockport. I was 13. It was replaced by a 1929 Model A Roadster Pickup - for \$15.00. It had the body tub and bed but no fenders. Also driven around the lot next door. I bought a 1940 Ford DeLuxe coupe when I was 15 and eventually drove it on the road after I got my license. It cost \$100.00. In 1955 I bought a 1950 Ford convertible, the first of many open cars. It had been owned by the Parts Manager at Hart-Taylor Motors in Spencerport and, of course, was loaded with every option available. In time, I replaced the flathead engine with one from a 1955 Ford, an OHV V8. Sold that not long after my first marriage in 1960, but not before taking it on our honeymoon to the Adirondacks.

Frst British car was a '58 Triumph TR3A, black with red interior. Nice car that led to other British cars, ending with my TR4A I have now."

Gil Langswager

"My first car was a 1938 Chevrolet 4 door sedan which I bought from my father in 1950 when he bought his first new car, a 1950 Chevrolet 2 door. As you can imagine, it was an old car in need of work. First it got a paint job. I was going with Betty at the time & she helped me. We used one of those "powder puff" kits that were available at the time. It served me well, but

when Betty & I got married she had a new 1951 Plymouth. We could only afford one car so I gave it back to my father. Yeah, those were the days!"

Brian Fallon

"My first car was a '52 MG TD. I bought in Dec of '58 from a used car dealer on West Main St. for \$750. It was not a good car but I loved it. Doris Britt and Don Stahl opened up Sports Car Service Center in March of '59 on South Ave. I became such a frequent customer that Don said to me "Brian, you can't afford this car unless you come to work for me". Thus, my entry into the car business in Rochester. I finally traded it in on a new '59 Sprite from Webb motors in Oct. '59."

Doris Britt

"The first car I ever owned was purchased on a whim. A big black '46 Packard Limousine caught my eye while visiting Waukegan III. The poor thing was standing in a farmer's lot surrounded by chickens and cows and for all the world seemed to be begging for rescue. I drove it home with just a note from the farmer attesting to my ownership, no plates, no registration....that's another story, but suffice it to say that when I got my MGTD (Alfie) from Churchill Motors and drove both vehicles alternately, I knew that I was hooked on driving....big or small, I couldn't wait to try them all!"

John MacDonald

"My first car was bought for me while in high school.

My father had a new '65 Mustang coupe with a 3 speed on the floor, a front bench seat and a 289. He decided, in order to keep me from asking for the keys all the time, that he would get me an old clunker to drive, a 1958 Renault Gordini.

This would not have been my first choice for a car by a loong shot.

But I didn't look the gift horse in the mouth.

To some this looked like a regular Dauphine, BUT no this one had a better

exhaust header which gave it an amazing 9 more horse power. This got it to 60 Mph, 7 seconds faster then the stock Dauphine, an amazing 30 seconds.

I think the shift linkage was by rubber bands. You could move the shifting knob in a 6 inch circle without taking it out of the gear it was in. Shifting was like row-

ing a boat with out the physical effort. Don't get me wrong this was good because with only 36 hp you did a lot of shifting.

I played football in high school. Coming back from a game with Tupper Lake, as our school bus rounded the curve in front of the school our coach bellowed out "Who the hell owns that car?". I was near the back of the bus, so had a hard time seeing over all the guys to see what he was talking about. Finally I could see the problem. It was the Gordini sitting crosswise in the ditch in front of school.

I confessed to owning the car. The coach asked why I had parked the car there. (Not necessarily in those

words.) I replied I'd left it in the parking lot. It seems that some of my team mates, who had ridden on the first bus to leave, got back with enough time to have some fun with my car. Taught me a lesson to never buy a car that can have the rear wheels lifted a foot off the ground, at the engine end, by 4 high school football players."




