

OLD BUSINESS: None

NEW BUSINESS:

MEMBER INITIATED ACTIVITIES: John Baum wants to encourage more member-initiated activities during driving season this year, similar to the Robbie Burns event that Desi Benet just organized but could be more last minute such as sending an e-mail blast on Monday that Friday the Club will meet for ice cream or dinner, etc.

AUTO CROSS: John Baum also mentioned that there was discussion at the most recent Board meeting about the possibility of reviving the auto cross event. George Haynes reminded us that it takes place in a large parking lot with cones and circles set up. One car goes through the course at a time and members would compete within their own car class. There is a trailer that contains all the equipment necessary. It's similar to gymkhana but there is no backing up. It was last held at MCC

but they raised the price so it was cancelled. John Baum mentioned this event has a long history with the Club and several members indicated interest in bringing it back.

TUNE-UP CLINIC: The Board also discussed the possibility of bringing back the Tune-Up Clinic. Let Hollis Hames or George Haynes know if you have any thoughts or ideas on who can put it together or how it could come about. MCC won't allow it anymore but Leon is talking with Bob Newell who runs the Fairport BOCES auto clinic. There is room there for eight cars and includes lifts. As incentive, could we move the scholarship to BOCES or simply make a donation to the BOCES program for use of the space? This needs to be organized in the next four months. Tony Makepeace mentioned that insurance is an issue. Leon said that we have blanket coverage for meetings, etc. but that an official function like this at a different facility would need a one-day endorsement to the policy to cover it including particulars about the site, the activity and expected attendance. George Haynes mentioned the Triumph Club uses the facility and that they require a volunteer from the faculty to assist that day in exchange for a \$100 stipend. George Haynes also mentioned that Tom Atkinson is the head of the tech program at the Wayne County BOCES and is pursuing that as a possibility.

SPOKES ADVERTISING: AI Fink commented that all advertisers have paid for 2014 and seem happy and should stay put so the group in SPOKES now is a solid core group. If there are any suggestions for new advertisers, please let Al know. Al reminded everyone that British Auto still has a free ad. Ted Hershev reminded us that British Auto was offered a free ad while they were trying to get back on their feet financially. Ted commented that we should be careful about offering something like that to one business over another. Al Fink said they have a quarter page ad for \$65 per year. Ted Hershey put forth a motion that British Auto be approached about paying for the ad starting next month. George Haynes accepted the motion and Leon Zak seconded it. All were in favor.


MOSS MOTORING CHALLENGE: Mike Goodwin does not yet know the results of the 2014 Challenge but logged in 9,876 miles on his car

VALVE COVER RACES / WINE AND CHEESE PARTY

Sunday, February 22, 2015 1 PM

Meet at Bushman Cabin in Henrietta Town Park, 595 Calkins Rd., Rochester, NY

Bring Hors D'Oevres or Dessert to pass, your own table service and favorite wine and cheese.

Coffee and Tea will be provided.

Valve Cover Racing Rules

The Cars:

- The cars shall have no power source. All motive force is provided by gravity.
- Cars shall be based on actual rocker box (cover) or cam cover from an MG or British made automobile engine.
- Wheelbase shall be no more than 24 inches. Note:
 The staging lane is only 24 inches long.
- Wheel Track hall be no more than 14 inches.
- Cars must have 4 wheels each no more than 6 inches in diameter.
- · Cars shall weigh 12 pounds or less
- Car design should allow the front wheels to touch a 2 inch high starting gate.
- Any car changed during the race is subject too inspection

The Course:

- The course shall consist of a launch incline 8 feet long, followed by a level run of 20 feet.
- Two lanes shall divide the launch incline, each 2 feet wide. The incline shall be 2 feet high at the rear-most part and level with the course at the front edge. The front edge shall be mitered to provide a smooth transition from the incline to the run-out area.

- The official "Starting Line" shall be 2 feet from the rear edge of the of the incline. A mechanized starting gate, which is 2 inches high, shall be provided.
- The Run out section of the course shall consist of 2 lanes, each 3 feet wide. The lanes shall be clearly marked.
- The finish line shall be marked 20 feet from the front edge of the launch incline.

The Races:

- · Cars will run in heats of 2 cars each.
- The cars are to be launched with their front wheels on the starting line. If your car design does not allow for this, it is at a disadvantage. The first car to have its front wheels cross the finish line is the winner. If neither car reaches the finish line, the car going further within its lane wins.
- If the wheels of a car should touch a lane marker, or cross over a lane marker, the car shall be disqualified. The competing car immediately becomes the winner.
- The winner of the round is the first car to win 2 races.
- Lanes are alternated between races.
- Winning cars will advance to the next round until all are eliminated but 1 car. Scoring is double-elimination to the finals. A car is eliminated after losing 2 rounds.

THE BEGINNING

How did "Partner's In Grime" get started? Let's get it on paper before dementia sets in and we can't remember.

Once upon a time, in the mid-nineties, the MG Club held it's business meetings at the Green Lantern in Fairport. At one meeting, a guest named Richard Stewart showed up and asked if anyone could rebuild an MG-TD engine for him. Gil Langswager and I kinda nodded at each other and then spoke to Richard as the meeting ended.

Richard had owned the TD many years. He and his wife Wilma had dated in the TD. The car was in Canesteo and the engine was out of it in a separate barn.

We made a date and drove down to see everything. Richard was a Maritime sailor who had a large herd of dairy cattle on the side. The route he gave had us driving over several dirt roads to reach the Stewart farm. We thought, "This is really The Boondocks!"

The engine was a mess. It had been completely rebuilt, but had sat directly under a leaky roof with the valve cover off, and water had rusted everything. Water in the cast alloy oil sump caused a big split when it froze. We said we could re-rebuild the engine for him, and loaded it into my van.

We were working with Van's Machine Shop at the time. Everything had to be disassembled and cleaned. Badly rusted parts were replaced. Some parts were OK to reuse. When we finished assembling the engine, we took the tow dolly to Canesteo and bought the TD to Webster. When it was all back together and running again, we dollied the TD to within a mile of Richard's house, took it off the dolly, and Gil drove it the rest of the way!

Talk about a Grand Entrance! Richard was delighted to see his TD driven again and later contracted for other work to be done: new tires, brakes and wiring harness. Although the car was still rough-looking, Richard and his kids drove it quite a bit, including one summer at Yale, where one was a student.

Sadly for Gil and me, Richard was not interested in, nor wanted to spend the money on, a complete cosmetic restoration, and I'm sure the doors still don't close correctly and the paint, top and interior are rough. But it ran well and got used again.

To this day we still receive Christmas card greetings from the Stewart family.

Of course we didn't know it yet, but this simple beginning led to many years of complete British car restorations by the "Partners In Grime". Next month Gil will tell you about the first one.

After traveling to the Detroit Car Show with a group of SCCA friends he bought a 2002 PT Cruiser for his daily driver while buying a 2002 Mini Cooper S to race. After winning a year end trophy in road tire class he upgraded to the 2005 Mini Cooper S but soon found he was slowly shifting from participation in Autocross to Sports Car Touring.



In 1998 he was finally able to buy one of his all-time dream cars a 1976, Tahiti Blue, Triumph TR6. He started to attend meetings and events with MG Car Club, and then with the Greater Rochester Triumph Touring Club



Immediately after buying the Triumph he participated in a driving event to the Roadster Factory in Pennsylvania for their annual summer party. Club members asked him when we arrived in PA what tools and parts he brought with him. His answer.....none. That's why I'm traveling with the group.

Together with Rhonda he co-hosted 14 fall tours for the MGCC. His personal favorites being "The Over and Under Tour" which used a road that went under the Erie Canal, "The Soul Tour" where we stopped to through shoes into the local shoe tree, and the "MGAlpaca Tour" which included stops at various alpaca farms in the area.





He was also proud to drive In the July 4th parade in his home town of Irondequoit.







Tom Magliozzi and his brother Ray were the co-host of NPR's Peabody Award winning weekly radio show, Car Talk, where they were known as "Click and Clack, The Tappet Brothers". The famed duo became the comedic voices behind the show in 1977, with its inception as a local program on Boston's WBUR, and together led it to become NPR's top rated entertainment broadcast. Tom died on November 3,2014 at age 77.

They bantered, told jokes, laughed and sometimes even gave pretty good advice to listeners who called in with their car troubles. Everyone loved them, even people not particularly interested in cars.

On December 16,2014 the sports car community lost one of it's long-time supporters and a FOUNDING MEMBER of the MG CAR CLUB, WESTERN NEW YORK CENTRE. Don also served as our Club's first chairman.

In 1959, Don along with MGCC member Doris Britt, founded Sports Car Sales on South Clinton Ave and began selling MGs and assorted other British gems. They were awarded the franchise for both BMC and Rootes Group cars. You can be sure many of our most treasured cars passed through their dealership or any of several other auto-related shops that the pair owned.

Don was the Executive Director of the Rochester Automobile Dealers Association with creative innovation throughout his career.

Many people had fun recollections of Don but some of the best were Gil Langswagers. Below are a few of his stories of 'back in the day ' with Don.



The club was founded by Don & several enthusiasts sitting at a bar in Tupper Lake in the fall of 1957. After that we commemorated the event by running a tour up there every fall. One year Don drove a brand new Jaguar XKE up. It was one of the first ones in the area and attracted quite a lot of attention

Several of our gang were racing at Dunkirk. Somebody called Don for a needed part so he got into a Mercedes Gullwing coupe he had just taken in trade & drove it down. He was making very good time at 120 mph or so when he was pulled over by a State Trooper. When the trooper came up to the car to talk to Don, He opened the door which hit the trooper in the chin, (gullwing door, remember?) Anyway, he got the part there!

The MG Car Club had a Halloween party every year and back then there was stiff competition for the best costume. One year Don came as an MGTD. He crawled inside a beautifully crafted cardboard red TD. Another time he & Doris Britt came as a matching speedometer & tachometer.

Several years & several cars later, Don acquired one of the MG TF replicars made in Victor by the Great Lakes Motor Car Co. This was a well designed TF body on an MGB drive train. It was quicker than a B and looked just like a TF. He & Pat drove it on one of George & Nancy Herschell's Mountain Adventures.

Don also bought one of Bob Tescione's Morgans, seen above at the MGCC 30th Anniversary party. He and Pat stayed active in the Morgan Club for the last 30+ years and Pat continues to be now.
