Restoration of my MG BGT V8 – Resumed By Dan Suter

I have been working on the restoration of my 1973 MG BGT V8 again. Of course, most people in the club will be familiar with this car, right? After all, it

was most recently on the cover of *Spokes –in*September 1988!

At this point it is probably fairly obvious that this is a long-stalled restoration project. I can't entirely explain why I let this car sit in a partially restored state, but work is actively underway again.

I bought my V8 when I was studying abroad in London. About 2 months before I left for London. I

learned about the existence of the BGT V8 model. WOW, I had to have one.

Every Wednesday, the Exchange-and-Mart came out and I would go over to the newsstand and get a copy first thing in the morning. If there were promising ads, I would return to the dorm and start calling to set up appointments. (Classes? Not on those days!). Riding the subway and trains I visited 5 or 6 V8s for sale all over the South of England.

After about 2 months of looking, I bought a bright red example down on the Channel coast town of Chichester. It is safe to say in my inexperience, I bought one with hidden rust issues. The couple selling it were very nice and helpful, but they hadn't owned it long. Like nearly all factory BGT V8s, it was a RHD Home Market model, with tinted windows and overdrive.

I recall being inexperienced about moving money, and my dad eventually had to do a transfer to my London bank account to pay for the car. My sister Chris was over visiting me the week we had to pick up the car and deliver it to 'Rola Shipping' for the journey to the USA. The day we had to go to Chichester, there was a Tube strike, so we walked halfway across London to get to the train station. After paying for the car, we set off to the nearby shipping terminal in a torrential rainstorm. We arrived safely and I have a picture of me standing

next to my V8 and two Jag E-types that were being shipped to America as well.

My dad and brother Jamie collected the car from the docks in Newark, NJ. My dad had hired a Customs

While I was still in the UK, Dad and Jamie flew to Newark on a 6AM flight one Thursday in April 1984. They started at Newark Customs near the docks; had to take a taxi to downtown Newark to file

broker who used to work with my grandfather at the Rochester office of US Customs. The car was bonded, and the import application paperwork was processed.

While I was still in the UK,

other papers, and returned to the dock to complete the release around 11:30AM. By now it was starting to rain, and they couldn't find the VIN plate on the car. The Customs agent declared he was going inside for coffee, and if Dad and Jamie didn't find the VIN on the car within 30 minutes, Customs would ship it back to England. Dad even called George Herschell seeking help, but George did not have knowledge of this model. To his huge credit, Jamie located the VIN plate, with the correct VIN number stamped, on it, right where it is supposed to be (partially obscured by part of the wiring harness and the factory remote oil filter bracket....). Once released, they filled up with fuel and proceeded to drive 325 miles to Rochester on the British registration plates. They saw several police cars en route including one at a rest stop, but no one ever asked about the British plates.

Dad was a little uncomfortable with the RHD arrangement and all the power the car had. He kept telling me later, "that thing is a rocket ship!". Jamie was fine with it! After 6 ½ uneventful hours, they arrived home safely to Irondequoit.

The next chapter involved registering it and all the Federal paperwork. NYS gave me a non-transferable registration initially. I obtained a one-time EPA exemption for personal import (rules have since changed), and spent a fair amount of the summer of 1984 typing a 74-page report for

NHTSA documenting features that were already identical to the USA-spec BGTs, or where I had converted to bring it into compliance. I submitted the report in August, and waited.

While I was home from college for Thanksgiving break in 1984, I received a letter from US Customs saying that they were scheduling an appointment to come seize the car to *crush it*, because they had not heard from NHTSA that it was approved for the

safety report. I panicked! However, my dad remained calm and instructed me to contact NHTSA. The agent there was helpful, noted the report was 'in review' status, and could I please give him a week to locate and complete it? NHTSA sent me a letter a week later

saying the car was approved. (To this day, I don't think they ever actually located my report, but simply declared it approved....). I submitted the completed NHTSA form to Customs, and they issued their release and returned the bond.

NYS finally issued me a transferable title, and the paperwork saga was over with.

Over the next 5 summers, I thoroughly loved this car. I often drove it to work (although the parking lot gates and pass-swipe system was a challenge with the RHD), drove it on dates with Mary Ellen, day trips to the Finger Lakes, concerts, MGCC rallies, car shows, gymkhanas, and other events, and generally enjoyed it. Getting on 590 in Irondequoit and winding it out through the gears was great fun! About a year after I bought it, I discovered that the wheels on my car were from the same family of

wheels on my car were from the same family of Dunlop alloy + steel designs from that era, but were the wrong version for a BGT V8. The former owner had not been aware of it either, but helped purchase a good used set of used V8 wheels and

shipped them to me. I also discovered the bright red color (essentially 1972 MG Flame Red) was incorrect and that my car was originally Harvest Gold—in fact, it was Harvest Gold with navy brushed nylon and vinyl interior.

The overdrive gearbox required a rebuild, and I took the opportunity to clean and repaint the engine compartment. I also learned how correct and original this early V8 (number 30 off the line) is –

original engine, gearbox, overdrive, steering rack, exhaust manifolds, carbs, radiator, gauges, rear end with the 3.07 gears, and all correct factory V8

parts except the re-paint color and wheels. I learned from the V8 Register that my car was a pre-production pilot car, and had a second role to be on-hand at a major London dealership the day the car was announced, in August 1973. All of the first 200 factory V8s were either Damask Red, Glacier White, or Harvest Gold, all with navy interior.

In 1985, while it was parked outside my apartment at college, an 18-wheeler dented the LF fender when swinging out of the parking lot across the street. The police found the driver, but he denied it and there was no red paint on his bumper, so I had no recourse.

Between the dent and the now-visible rust issues, the car was starting to look a little worse-for-wear. So, I thought I would take it apart, get the body restored, changing to the year-correct maroon Damask Red as the new color. The plan was to do this project and quickly put it back together. Not quite.

We're started in April, but it's not too late to jump in. We'll wrap it up around the end of October and announce the winners and prizes shortly thereafter. (Not a MGCC member? See elsewhere in Spokes or on the website regarding how to become a member – it's quick, easy, inexpensive, and you need not own an MG to join.)

To participate in the **Motoring Challenge**, simply:

Find the list of destinations elsewhere in Spokes.

- > Drive to one or more of the listed destinations.
- Snap a picture of your car there, preferably with yourself or your teammate in the photo. (We need AT LEAST ONE photo that includes a good likeness of you. Let's get to know each other, eh?)
- Send the photo(s) by email to challenge@mgcarclub.com.
- Enjoy the monthly updates in *Spokes*, where you'll see yours and other competitors' photos, and get updates on scoring along with the challenges for the new month.

You'll score 1 or more points for each destination. Points may vary, based on the difficulty or the creativity required. Additionally, <u>early-bird bonus points</u> may be given occasionally for photos received before a certain date, so pay attention monthly to get the most points possible. (Late photos won't get the early-bird bonus, but they aren't worthless, just worth a bit less!) There's no monthly cut-off date, (we'll accept March destination photos in September, for example!) but <u>all_photos will be due before the final tally sometime around November 1st</u>.

Some of the destination photos will have special requirements. Any such requirements will be listed each month. For example, if the destination is "Your Favorite Restaurant", we may require that the photo include a sign showing the name of the restaurant. Or, if the destination is "Outside of NY State", we may require a sign (like WELCOME TO NEW JERSEY) or other clear evidence (like the Gateway Arch or Grand Canyon, for example) be shown in the photo.

Rather than filling out a form or marking a checklist, each month, one or more destinations will be listed in *Spokes*, and each will be identified with a destination number. When you submit your photos, be sure to include the corresponding destination number for each. Remember, each photo must:

- show your car
- show the destination (and/or other requirement) clearly

Though not always REQUIRED we'd like it if you include yourself in each photo)

Some of you might have more than one special car you'd like to use in the Motoring Challenge. This is permitted, but we strongly encourage participation using only your special car(s). The point is to encourage driving and having fun with these special cars; it is NOT our intention to award points for driving around in your daily-driver 2019 RAV4 or your 2017 Honda Accord or even your 2013 Ford Focus.

HOW TO ENTER: No forms to fill out, just email us your first photo(s)! We need:

- 1 Your name(s)
- 2 Year, make, and model of the car(s) you intend to use for the challenge
- 3 Attach your photos, identified with the DESTINATION NUMBER.

That's it! It's easy to get started! Jump right in! Safety Fast!

(You'll find this month's destinations on the last page of Spokes.)

One last note - the MG Car Club WNY Centre reserves the right to use your photo(s) in Spokes and on the club's website - and we look forward to doing so!



Not to do anything halfway, all the sheet metal came off and each piece was painted individually. By the time he was done, it was a complete off-frame restoration with all the chrome being sent to Buffalo for refinishing. Every part was labeled with a tag and the smaller pieces placed in zip-lock bags. (While detailing the MG we found one of the tags and left it under the dash for posterity.)

Pop died in December of 2018 and since then we've been downsizing his estate. My sister and I had planned on keeping the TD, but recently came to the conclusion to sell the car as she needed someone to love and pamper her. May the next owner enjoy this beautiful machine as much as Pop did! It will turn heads wherever you go.
