MG Car Club Western New York Centre Bylaws:

ARTICLE II Elected Officers

1. The elected Officers of this Club shall consist of: Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer,

Activities Director, and two Trustees, one to be elected by a majority of the membership at the

annual election. The second Trustee shall be the immediate past Chairman of the Club. In the case of the immediate past Chairman declining the position, the second Trustee position will be elected by a majority of the membership at the annual election. The balloting shall be secret.

- 2. No elected Officer shall hold the same office for more than two consecutive years.
- 3. Nominations for Officers will be made from the floor at the regular meeting prior to the annual election in November.
- 4. A vacancy in any office shall be filled at the next regular meeting by nominations from the floor and a majority vote of the members present. Exception shall be the automatic promotion of Vice-Chairman to Chairman.
- 5. The term of office shall commence January 1st following the election of officers.

ARTICLE II Duties of Elected Officers

1. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to preside at all meetings, to appoint all committees not

otherwise provide for, to enforce the observance of the by-laws and to cast the deciding vote in case of ties.

- 2. It shall be the duty of the Vice-Chairman to perform all the duties of the Chairman in his absence, and be the to be a liaison between the board and committee chairpersons.
- $3. \ It \ shall \ be the duty of the Secretary to attend to and keep a record of all correspondence and$
- proceedings of the Club. He/she shall give each member notice of all meetings, special meetings,
- all coming events, and such other information as given him/her by other Officers.
- 4. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and disburse all funds. He/she shall keep accurate records of all receipts and expenses and make a report at each meeting.
- 5. It shall be the duty of the Activities Director to coordinate all events of the Club. No event shall be staged without his/her approval. He/she is to see that trophies or awards are provided as necessary for each event, and to send information of all events to the Secretary that he/she may notify the membership.
- 6. It shall be the duties of the Trustees to assist the Board with planning and decision making,

maintain contact with England and the other MG Car Clubs in the US and Canada, provide history to the Board, and assist the Board with research and Special projects.



Upping the Ante, part VI - by Mike Robinson

Mike's saga of installing a GM aluminum V8 into his pretty black MGB

In the last chapter I showed the work done to get the engine ready for the first start, so this month's edition will cover that alone, as it was a pretty significant event. The following chapters will cover the four link rear suspension, fuel tank and some other minor tweaks that needed to be done, then finally, the exhaust installation. With any luck, I'll have the car finished by the end of April as of this writing. With everything done as far as the engine, it was time for the first start. My engine builder, Frank Hutchinson of Irondequoit, offered to come down to be there for the first start to make sure everything went smoothly. A note was sent out to the club and a few came by to witness the event. I really appreciated Don Welch coming by with his camera to record all the video and pictures you see in this article, as I was a bit busy tending to the startup. All pictures you see are courtesy of Don.



Here Frank is double checking the distributor install and doing a static timing on #1 cylinder after it snorted and popped a few times the first time we tried starting it. Sure enough the timing was close but not quite.



The Man. The Legend. Frank Hutchinson was the person responsible for the engine work. Frank was referred to me by Dan Suter, as Frank had rebuilt the engine for Dan's factory V8 car and had many good things to say about him, and I heartily agree. If you are considering any engine work in the future I would highly recommend Frank.




Yours truly getting his fingers into things by putting the valve cover back on. I couldn't just stand back and watch, I had to do something relevant to the day, and this was deemed harmless enough.

Upping the Ante, cont'd



Although it's difficult to tell in a still picture, it is running. After the distributor was reset, it fired right off and ran strong. Frank ran the engine for 15 minutes between 2,000 and 2,500 RPM to break the lifters in to the cam. Afterwards the timing was set at idle and at 3,000 RPM. The only hiccup to the day was when I did not have the radiator cap on all the way and it piddled through the overflow. I chalk that up to being just like a puppy, the car was just excited to have its new engine.



The event was determined to be a success. After the engine settled down into a nice idle, it was time to celebrate. I thought Old Speckled Hen was a good choice to anoint a British car with, so the bottles were passed around.

It's difficult to capture in still pictures the significance of a first start, so here is a video I took after all was done and everyone had left.





For perhaps the biggest moment of the conversion, it's a short one this month content wise, but next chapter we'll look at the rear suspension upgrades and what was done to accomplish that. Stay tuned.

Where It All Started

I grew up in East Irondequoit, on a quiet suburb street. Knew nothing about engines or mechanics, so self-taught. Trial and error, lots of error, and the public library for reference on how to and not to. Built minibikes from bike frames powered by lawnmower motors. Summer of 1966, the next door neighbor that I cut his grass and did jobs for, asked me if I was interested in the small car in the garage. Now I had been in there a lot and did not know there was a car in there. It had belonged to a friend, lost contact, and had no interest in it, but they were moving, and the garage had to be cleaned. If I wanted it, I would have to clean out the garage, move it, and ok it with my dad.

Tucked in the back of his garage under piles of wood, boxes, a rug and stuff, was a small convertible. After a full morning of taking trash to the curb etc., revealed a 1963 MG Midget. No top, filled with parts? tires, trash, a nest of something in the trunk, 3 flat tires on the car, and covered in thick dust grime, you get the picture. Today we would call it a barn find. To me, a CAR! Little did I know it would take more than a year to make it run and pass NYSI. I hand- pumped up the tires and pushed it home. Mr. Bower transferred the registration to my dad. I did not consider any of that stuff. When it came time, Dad sold me the car for one dollar. He said it would look better to the DMV if there was some money exchanged rather than me given a car from a neighbor that was not his car, and no one knew where the real owner was. Looking back on it now with all the paperwork to license a car today, I guess it was a lot less then.

It was a learning as I went. I figured, it was put together with screws nuts and bolts. I knew enough about small engines; I should be able to figure out what made it work, how to take it apart, get it back together and make it run. I Found the MG dealer in Rochester, Sports Car Sales. Close enough to ride my bike to for parts and maybe help.

The parts guy, that I got to know was a wealth of how-to and what might be the problem. One time he asked if I had a repair manual. No. I remember it was



a lot more than I could afford at the time. The next time I went for parts, he presented me a beat up well used, dirty, greasy ratty no cover shop manual. It was a shop toss out he said. I saved it for you. It was the bible to the car for me. Now I could see and understand what it was supposed to do, what was inside, how it came apart and how it was adjusted to do it. I even hand copied pages that were just too hard to read. Cut out the illustrations and pasted them on my pages. Life before Xerox.

Fast forward about a year. Reading that manual, I guess hundreds of times; I made it run and well. My mom helped with covering the seats. I painted it with Rust-oleum paint. I was not a painter; did not know you need to thin it before you spray it. So, it was orange peel. Oh well. A new set of tires from the local Western Auto; It passed inspection on the first try!

I drove it for two more years and yes in the winter too. Lots of heat in a midget!! Not. The only time it complained was a ski trip to Mt Snow Vermont. That night it snowed a lot, back when it snowed in the winter, and was very cold, it would not start the next morning. It took a full day to warm up before it would start. That was the only time it failed to run.

Where It All Started, cont'd

I sold it in 1969 and went off to college, graduated and returned. Bought a 1970 MGB roadster. Sometime later I thought happed to what midget? In the late 70s with some digging, I found it! Behind a garage in Webster. I could have it if I wanted it. The owner lost interest in the project. A fully stripped body shell, The parts back there too. Weeds growing up through what was the floors and engine bay, bottom sunk in the dirt. I tried to pick it out, but it broke at the door sill on

The parts person at Sport Car Sales, which later became Pacesetter Motors, was Al Simonetti, we remained friends, and I would stop in on Lake Avenue to look at the new models and talk cars. He sold me the 1970 MGB roadster and a few years latter my 1974 MGBGT that I still have today. In 1976 I joined the MGCC and later found out Doris Britt and her husband, founding members of the club, were past owners of Sports Car Sales. Small world.

one side. Set it back down, and looked through the parts. I did not find that old manual though. That really would have been the prize. I took the steering wheel and smiled.

Little did I know that a black midget rescued from the neighbor next store to where I grew up, would be the beginning of 58 years of MGs and an entire group of friends that have the same love and appreciation for British sports cars.

Race Cars in our MGCC

An Introduction - By Dan Suter

This issue kicks off a series featuring race cars in our MG Car Club Western NY Centre, both past and present. This month we feature Dave Wild's Elva Courier which he raced in SCCA E-Production from approximately 1960-1968. Additionally, we are featuring Al Costich's 1968 MGB/GT which he has rebuilt and raced from the 2001-2 timeframe and is still racing!

In this series, we will hope to cover additional race cars including many more of our current competitors such as the Midgets of Ted Hershey, Joe Puma, Doug Faust, and Dick Rzepkowski. In terms of former race cars, we will seek to include the Bob Burns/Dick Powers MGA 1600 MKII, Dave Wilds MG TD, and hopefully Ken Barlow's dad's Sprite. If anyone knows of cars and owners that can be added to this list, please contact me. Enjoy!

Elle Va, The story of a 1959 Elva Courier - By Dave Wild

A contraction of the two French words.

"Elle va," meaning "she goes" formed the name of Elva Engineering founded by Frank Nichols of Great Britain. They began producing performance parts for English Ford engines. The first Elva car

was built in 1955 solely as a race car. They continued building sports racing cars with Coventry Climax engines and Formula Junior cars with Austin and DKW engines.

The Elva Courier was introduced in 1958 as a dual-purpose sports car that could be raced or perhaps a race car that could also be driven on the

road. The Courier was introduced to the United States at the 1958 New York Auto Show.

In 1961, Continental Motors of Washington, who had been one of the main importers of Couriers in the USA, ordered (30) additional Couriers but later canceled the order. Frank Nichols supplied all the parts and engines for that order and money was tight. He ended up selling the rights to the Courier to Trojan, Ltd later that year. Trojan was a

manufacturer of power lawnmowers, go-carts, Lambretta scooters and had also been building an English version of the Heinkel "bubble" car.

Trojan Ltd built Couriers from 1962 to 1965, then was building McLaren-Elva V8 powered race cars. Ken Sheppard Sports Cars built the last 26 Couriers.

A total of approximately 620 Couriers were built MkI, II, III, and IV. The MK IVs had independent rear suspensions and MGB 1800cc engines. Some MK I and II cars were sold as kit cars with and without engines. Engines used were mostly 4-cylinder BMD 1500 'B" blocks as used in MG, Morris, Riley, Austin, and Wolseley. Some were equipped Coventry Climax 1100cc and 1500cc

engines. A few later MK IV T-Types were equipped with Ford or BMW engines.

We visited the Trojan factory in July 1962 while attending the British Grand Prix at Aintree. The production line at Trojan, just Southeast of London was basic with about six Couriers being pushed along manually as construction was going on.

Elle Va, cont'd

Ours is the 16th Courier built by Elva Engineering. It is registered as a 1959 but I believe it was built in 1958. We obtained it from Ripley Motor Co, Ithaca, NY. It probably came from Chuck Deitrich who was the early East Coast distributor, based in Ohio.

We registered the car for the road in the summer of 1960 in order to get used to its characteristics, then

prepared it for competition. It has since only been used in competition. I found it to be precise and delightful at speed with neutral handling.

The 1489cc 4-cylinder engine in our car was sourced from a Morris Oxford or Austin Cambridge sedan and brought to MGA specs, originally at about 70bhp. I modified it within SCCA rules using 10:1 compression pistons and ported, polished, and relieved the intake and exhaust. It is fully balanced with a radiused crankshaft and set up to tolerate an occasional 6000rpm. The clutch is "beefed" up with heavier springs. It is equipped with two Bendix electric fuel pumps to keep it fed at the high end. I experienced some brake fade with the drum brakes so I drilled holes in the front brake backing plates and added small air scoops to cool them.

Our Courier has a round tubular ladder type frame with a fiberglass body. By virtue of its light weight (about 1300lb) it will accelerate with a street Corvette up to about 50mph! Top speed is about 120mph but with today's technology they will do about 140 and they are still competitive in vintage racing!

Our Courier came equipped with Pirelli tires which were difficult to balance and created bad vibration. Since I had previously raced our MGTD on Michelin tires with good results, I replaced the Pirellis with Michelin X and had no further trouble.

I experienced two incidents at the Glen with the Elva that could have ended badly but did not.

Running at full throttle up the hill from the old Start/Finish line after the "90", I met with a bird going in the opposite direction (closing rate maybe 90 to 100mph). He hit me square in the face bubble shield, knocking my helmet sideways and twisted it to cover one eye. All I saw was black feathers. I guess it was a crow but it felt like a pterodactyl!

The second incident is a bit of a long story. It had been raining for several days, and continued for race day. The false grid where they formed us up before moving us out on the starting grid for the race was a sea of mud and oil leaks from British cars that had gone before. We were doing standing starts at that time. I had pulled a good starting position in the second row behind a couple of Porsches. Everyone was on open treaded "wet" tires.

As the starting flag dropped, the Porsche spun his tires and unloaded the sticky greasy mud directly on my face shield, eliminating any chance of my seeing anything. It takes two hands to unsnap and move the face shield and I was busy at full throttle shifting and grasping at any water to clear the shield. I let off the

throttle for an instance but then realized that there were 30 cars behind me at full throttle, so put my foot back into it. I had been racing the Glen for many years by then and knew the course well. I managed to clear the bend at the start, go up the hill to the slight curve and onto the straight on instinct and luck without hitting anything before getting my visor cleared. I did not tell Barbara about that until several years later for fear that would be the END of my racing! At the end of the day, I had a moment to think Holy S___ what did I just do!



Additional notes: Dave worked with a partner to film portions of the 1963 SCCA racing season, filming his race entries at Dunkirk and Watkins Glen. They later submitted this film to a WXXI competition. It can still be viewed with a link on our MGCC website. It is called "A Look at Sports Car Racing." In it, one can see how popular Elva Couriers were in E-Production, as 4-5 others are visible in the events.

Dave raced at several tracks in the Northeast including Watkins Glen and Dunkirk, NY. The website Racing Sports Cars captures at least a partial record of results for Dave from the 1959-65 period with both his MG TD and Elva. I believe Dave raced the Elva through 1968, so this resource can only be considered as a partial record for Dave's racing.

Al Costich's Road to the Collier Cup

y story starts in the mid-60s. My brother bought a Triumph TR3. I loved that car! Back then I was attending high school in Watkins Glen, New York, and went to the race track there to watch Can-Am. Trans Am, and Formula One races. Years later when I returned from

Vietnam in 1971, I asked my brother for advice on buying a car. Apparently he and his Triumph did not part on friendly terms! He suggested that I look for an MGB instead, because it had a more sophisticated suspension. So I bought a used chrome bumper MGB. That MG stood me in good stead until

I got married.

After my marriage was concluded, I got a well-used '73 MGB/GT. With it, I learned how to weld by replacing the sills and passenger floor, as I also garnered some mechanical abilities by replacing the clutch and various other bits and pieces it needed. Meanwhile, I volunteered at SVRA's tech inspection during their vintage race weekend at Watkins Glen every September. On those race weekends, I would spend Saturday evenings on the cabin porch of the nearby historic Seneca Lodge, with members of the MG Car Club Western New York Centre, where





some us would share a few drinks and bench talk about "What car would you build and race if you had the financial wherewithal?"

For those ten years or so I had been badgering one of their members to cut loose a MGB/GT that he was holding hostage in his barn. Long story short - he needed money for a new well pump and I had just been laid off from Hewlett Packard with a wad of cash in my pocket! A deal was struck and I now owned a bare-bones MGB/GT racecar tub with a roll cage welded in it. It took me the better part of a year to source the parts that I need for it, and to build a race motor, as I transformed it into a real race car.

Then it was off to a two ers' school with Track Time a Glen, followed by my first ra with it in June of 2001 with Sports Racing. I've raced it n since then and these days I d

Saturday evening we will have a fun pub night style activity.


Sunday we are debating on hosting a car show with awards. Another possibility is to organize a funkhana and possible valve cover racing before we head our separate ways.


