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Road to the MG Collier Cup

Al Costich's 1968 MG BGT Vintage Race Car

My story starts in the mid-60s. My brother bought a Triumph TR3. I loved that car! Back then I was attending high school in Watkins Glen, New York and went to the race track there to watch Can-Am, Trans Am, and Formula One races. Years later when I returned from Vietnam in 1971, I asked my brother for advice on buying a car. Apparently, he and his Triumph did not part on friendly terms! He suggested that I look for an MGB instead, because it had a more sophisticated suspension. So, I bought a used chrome bumper MGB, That MG stood me in good stead until I got married.

After my marriage was concluded, I got a well-used '73 MGB/GT. With it, I learned how to weld by replacing the sills and passenger floor, and I also garnered some mechanical abilities by replacing the clutch and various other bits and pieces it needed. Meanwhile, I volunteered at SVRA's tech inspection during their vintage race weekend at Watkins Glen every September. On those race weekends, I would spend Saturday evenings on the cabin porch of the nearby historic Seneca Lodge, with members of the MG Car Club-Western New York Centre, where some of us would share a few drinks and bench talk about "What car would you build and race if you had the financial wherewithal?"

For those ten years or so I had been badgering one of our club members to cut loose a MG/BGT that he had been storing in his barn. Long story short — he needed money for a new well pump and I had just been laid off from Hewlett Packard with a wad of cash in my pocket! A deal was struck and I now owned a bare-bones MGB/GT racecar tub with a roll cage welded in it. It took me the better part of a year to source the parts that I needed for it, and to build a race motor, as I transformed it into a real race car. Then it was off to a two-day driver's school with Track Time at the Glen, followed by my first race

there with it in June 2001 with Historic Sports Racing. I have raced it many times since then and these days I do maybe three vintage races a season with it. I keep trying to race at the many different race tracks that I used to read about in Sports Car Graphic magazine back when I was a kid in high school.

The first MG Vintage Racer's (MGVR) Focus Event I raced in was at Virginia International Raceway in 2003. When I heard that another MGVR Focus Event was going to be held at Grattan, Michigan, in 2012, I knew I had to be part of it too! I had watched racing at that track for a number of years. In October, 2013, I journeyed off to the new mega Circuit of the Americas vintage races in Texas. What an extravagant event that was! Earlier last year I followed up with a trip to the famed Indianapolis "brick yard" race track – for another spectacular vintage race event! Then this September (2014) was the very special US Vintage Grand Prix, with its All-MG Collier Cup race, held by SVRA at Watkins Glen, and supported by MGVR, that I just had to make!

SVRA's Watkins Glen vintage race weekend in September is always my favorite event of the season. It's a time for me renew old acquaintances and see some more interesting and beautiful cars in a race venue, which is where they deserve to be viewed. as well interacting with such a large spectator crowd. It is indeed heart-warming

how MG racers are so willing to help each other out in the paddock with each other's MGs, and socialize together, and yet be so competitive and gentlemanly towards each other while racing on the track! I just wish I could have spent more time this year neighboring with some of the other racers there.

Not to be overlooked this year was the special police escorted trip for selected race cars — especially the featured MGs — from the track back over the original 6.6 mile old street race course to downtown Watkins Glen on Friday afternoon, where the town held a fantastic street party for everyone!

Almost 100 racing MGs – including 30 MGBs – came to compete at Watkins Glen for four days in September. The event included a special MG Vintage Racers' banquet Saturday evening. For me, being able to race with five other MGB/GTs was indeed a rare and special treat! But my biggest highlight, and total surprise, was being singled out by my fellow MG racers to be honored with being awarded the prestigious Collier Cup on Sunday, right after my Collier Cup MG race! This cup has been awarded each year since 1985 to one MG racer in the Collier Cup race, as voted by the MG racers in that race, as "Best Representing the Overall Spirit of MG Vintage Racing" and is unrelated to winning any race!

I've raced at many tracks, and every season I try to add a new one that I haven't raced at before, but Watkins Glen is always a must on my schedule! Next year (2015) I'm looking forward to trying Elkhart Lake's Road America in Wisconsin with the VSCDA. I've never won any races, but I'm not out there to win. I'm there for the cars, for the

camaraderie with other MG racers, and for racing our valiant steeds with each other. I love racing my MG! (Not to mention that my everyday car is a '71 MGB tourer).

Additional notes: Al indicates in the years since this article was written, that he has raced at the following tracks: Watkins Glen many times, Mosport, Lime

Rock, Road America, Mid-Ohio, Summit Point, Pittsburgh International, Thompson International, Circuit of The Americas, and Indianapolis. In terms of any on-track incidents: I have been hit twice at Summit Point on two different occasions. Grazed the wall at Watkins coming out of turn nine.

Upgrades have included: An improved Go-Pro, and installation of a Quaife limited slip unit.

Regarding reliability, Al has achieved great longevity from his race engine. Eventually, however: I had holed a piston and broke some rings so did a full rebuild. Also, I did haul the car to Jim Ford Dyno in Fulton NY. Very disappointing-engine produced not much more than stock HP and torque.

On the next lap I passed Drew Cullen in his superbly prepared MG BGT.


He spun in front of me coming out of turn seven. I missed collecting him up by inches, but, I passed him!

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Mike's saga of installing a GM aluminum V8 into his pretty black MGB

So last month we reviewed the first startup, and this latest, and final, segment will cover some of the other mods that were done to the car, as well as an overview of my impressions since finishing it.

Starting at the front of the car, a big change was made to the brakes, and a minor change to the suspension. For the brakes, I used Frontline Development's Four Pot calipers, and 10 inch vented rotors, along with new stainless brake hoses. For the Suspension, I used Frontline also, this time for their Tube Shock conversion with adjustable dampers. After reading reviews of the Spax and Moss kits, I was glad to read the very positive reviews of the Frontline kit. While I had it all apart I greased the wheel bearings and shimmed the hubs. The captions below the pictures explain the differences.



As you can see, the front shock is replaced by a hefty aluminum forging and stout welded steel tube wishbones. There is zero flex in this setup, which is a big complaint with the Spax and Moss kits. The kit does require modifying the front crossmember by cutting off the mounting tabs for the bump stops, and adding a bracket to the spring pan. It's a very simple conversion and could probably be done with the crossmember on the car. I have the ride set right in the middle at 6 clicks. At zero it was a very soft forgiving ride, but I wanted it a little firmer, but not





over the top. So far it seems to be working really well

Here the front brake kit has been installed. Frontline has replicated the 4 pot calipers as used on the MG RV8 cars. They are very effective with the larger diameter disk. The one drawback to the kit if you can call it that, is you must use 15 inch wheels as they will not clear stock 14 inch wheels. What I really like about them however is pads can be changed without removing the caliper, although if the disks need to be turned or replaced they would have to come off anyways.

Upping the Ante, cont'd

Now moving on to the rear of the car, here is where the two biggest changes took place. I got rid of the rear drum brakes and replaced them with Frontline's rear disk brake kit, and also ditched the leaf springs and shocks in favor of Bill Guzeman's 4 link kit with adjustable coilover shocks. I also replaced the factory 3:90 gear set with a 3:07 gear set, and installed a Triple J Limited Slip Differential. Captions below the pictures explain the steps, starting with the four link installation.



First thing that needed to be done was remove the rear axle housing, shocks, rear sway bar, and cut away the battery box. Relocating the battery is not necessary. All that needs to be done is trim the inside corner back, but I decided to move it to the trunk anyway for easier access, hence I cut the box away completely. I relocated the battery leads and fuel lines while I was at it.



After I removed all the bits, I installed the upper four link brackets using the original shock mounting

holes, and I put the rear axle housing back in place to use a starting point for the rear axle alignment. I was very fortunate in having a car that tracked straight with an axle that was centered very well in the car, so I figured it was a good reference point to start from.

I taped a sheet of paper to the floor and using a rafter square, centered it on the end of the axle and made a mark, then rotated the square 90 degrees and



made another mark to indicate where the axle ends should be centered. I used a short piece of plywood bolted to the flange and using an angle gauge, set my pinion flange to the recommended 4 degrees. The plywood leg keeps it in position so it doesn't move on me. I then put the upper control arms in place in the brackets.



Upping the Ante, cont'd

The kit includes 4 plates that need to be welded to the top of the axle tubes. The directions gave the dimensions of where they should be located on the axle, so I inserted the bolts into the plates and through the links and clamped them in place while I adjusted the links to get the tabs where they needed to be. These were then tack welded in place. I do not trust my welding skills enough to do the job, so I took it to a local welder and had them welded on for good.



After I got it back from the welder I power washed the housing and painted it. It was then hauled over to Ben at British Auto to have the LSD and gear set installed, and to have the lash set.



Once I got it back from Ben it was time to install it. First the lower brackets were bolted to the axle, then I jacked it up in place and connected the lower links to the former front leaf spring perch, and to the lower bracket. Then it was just a case of turning the link adjusters until the axle lined up with the marks

I made on the paper earlier. I was quite amazed at how easy the whole process was.



The coil over assemblies were next to go in, and following the suggestions in the instructions, installed in the center holes of the bracket. There is a lot of adjustment possible with this set up for ride height and ride control, and this single change really transformed the ride and handling of the car. There is no rear sway bar, but in truth it's no longer needed. The car corners flat, and I have not had any indications of wandering or bump steer, even on a rough road.



The next big change was the rear brakes. I ditched the rear drums for Frontline's rear disk brake kit. Very easy to install the calipers and disks but the parking brake is a bit fiddly. In fact I still don't have it set up as a reliable parking brake as of this writing but I know what I have to do to fix it. Same as the front brake kit, the pads can be replaced without removing the calipers.

After all of this was done, and after successful first start, the car was taken to The Muffler Shop in Fairport where a custom exhaust system was fabricated and installed using stainless tubes. My mufflers are Thrush Turbo mufflers and the sound is just about perfect. Not too loud until I really get on it. I didn't get any pics of the exhaust system so I'll just leave it by saying they did a really nice job making it fit, and I thought the price was reasonable enough.

So... what's it like driving? You may be asking. In short, all I can say is – "ohhhh BABY!"

This is the car MG should have made. The power is effortless. The torque is more than ample. I climbed the hill going into West Bloomfield on Rt. 5/20 eastbound in 5th gear without so much as a grunt. With the 3:07 gears, starting from a stop does require a bit more throttle than I anticipated and I have stalled it twice, but now that I am used to it it's not an issue. The only nit I have is the clutch pedal effort is very heavy. It's a linear travel on the throwout bearing, and without the mechanical advantage of a throwout fork leveraging the input effort, it takes a lot of leg to move the clutch pedal. Again, now that I am used to it, it's not an issue, but if you should notice my left leg is considerably more muscular than my right... now you know why.

I'm still somewhat in a break-in stage with the engine so I haven't really gotten on it yet, but the one time I did, I left a couple of nice strips of rubber in first and second gear, a little bit less in third, and I even got a healthy chirp in 4th. By then I was pushing 90 MPH and decided to back off. The brakes are VERY effective with no pull or fade evident and hauled me back down to 55 without

breaking a sweat. Maggie was riding with me and she screamed, so I knew it was perfect. ©

As far as teething issues I have had three. The swivel adapter for the oil filter assembly leaked when the gasket failed, and the second was because yours truly forgot to put the O ring on the distributor before it went into the hole. The third was the limited slip sounded like a dozen ghosts knocking and rattling chains during a séance when cornering at low speed. A quick call to Triple J and they recommended Ford LSD Additive that comes in a four ounce bottle. I added that to the LSD lubricant I put in after Ben rebuilt it, and within 50 feet it was no longer making any noise.

So far I have put a little over 300 miles on the car, and I am amazed at the transformation. I have a few other things to address, namely get rid of the poly suspension bushes and go to V8 rubber bushes, and a different tire size and profile. The ride quality with the four link is superb, however with the narrow tire sidewall and the poly bushes, I feel every grain of sand in the road and it's just too harsh. I am looking for a Grand Touring ride quality more than a zoom zoom race car, so some changes need to be made.

If you are even thinking about doing a V8 or even a V6 conversion on your B, I highly recommend it. Yes it's an expense, but no more than buying another used car, and the grins per mile blows any car of today out of the water. Oh and I'm also getting about 23 miles to the gallon, and turning 2250 RPM at 65 MPH in 5th gear. I'd probably get more if I kept my foot out of it but where's the fun in that?







Motoring Challenge Photos













After the delightful morning with a few of you in Churchville Park last month, I headed for home in my '51 TD. No sooner had I cleared the lane onto the road, the engine died. Reminiscent of last year when I had vapor lock problems on 80 degree days. But it had run just fine on the 15 mile trip to the park earlier, and it had just sat for several hours – the engine was not hot, and the carbs were cool to the touch. Nevertheless, breaking the fuel line right after the fuel pump and then immediately reattaching it got the engine started again. I drove on a mile or two, and it stalled again. Disconnected the fuel line, reconnected, and I was off for another couple of miles. An hour later, and about a dozen repeats of this, got me home. (After several come-get-me calls last summer, my wife says she would not look forward to having to rescue me any more.)

So what could be the problem? When I turned the key first thing in the morning, the pump ticked away like always. But each time I stalled out, it seemed as if it was hanging up. Thinking about it that night, I hit upon the idea of testing the pump by running the gas into a container, with the engine off, so I could hear if the pump hung up.

A great idea I thought, but the pump tested fine. I still suspected it though – it hadn't been tested with a back-pressure load like it would get with the engine running. And it was one of those darn intermittent problems where you never know for sure. I ordered a rebuild kit from Abbingdon Spares.



I blew out the fuel line to make sure it wasn't plugged at the tank outlet



Testing the pump: pumping fuel into a gas can, engine not running. No failure - it worked perfectly for several gallons.



Disconnected the fuel lines, the 2 power wires, and unbolted it from the tool box. Darn Whitworth bolts.



Ready to go. On my workbench, upstairs in the barn



The tape covers the joint between the plastic cap and the iron solenoid housing

Ah, the Fuel Pump, cont'd




Right: the solenoid housing with the diaphragm & gasket still attached

The kit came with <u>all</u> the moving parts, and gaskets



The new "rocker" device with points on top. The diaphragm stem screws up into the threads of the little center crosspiece



I took lots of detail pictures so I'd remember where everything went!



Rocker mechanism & wiring assembled and screwed to the top of the solenoid housing.



The new varistor replaces the old capacitor. The twin-point contact blade must be spaced with a feeler gauge.

Ah, the Fuel Pump, cont'd



The lower assembly with the old strainer to the right of the lower aluminum housing, & one of the brass check valve discs to the left. Fuel flows in lower left, thru strainer, out left.



All ready to screw back together. Bottom of the diaphragm spacer & gaskets on right. Old check valve parts above.



Paragraph 9c: "the pump is now ready for testing" - and it clicks away as soon as I turned the key!



Pump is screwed onto its bracket, bracket bolted back onto the tool box. Wires & fuel lines all hooked up.



Pump runs like a champ – hasn't missed a beat since! Don is Happy!!



These are the only ones that will fit!




