






Editor's "truth in story" note: The sun wasn't really in the north that day. I got a late start, so I actually took these Oatka Trail pictures on the way home.

June 25

In the beginning: I should have taken a before picture. Those old Boy Scout canoes in the background were stacked in the rear of this space beside the barn, an old truck cap was in the middle covered with weeds, and there was a muddy parking spot in front for our pop-up camper.

Our neighbor Pete cleared out the brush, leveled it with some fill, and bored the post holes. The horizontal 2 x 4's are just to stabilize the posts.





July 20-28

The rafters. I decided to raise everything about a foot. Attached a 2 x 10 to the side of the roof, to fasten the rafters to, and raised the headers at the top of the posts – made for a better ceiling height. 2 x 4 purlins across the tops of the rafters. August we went on vacation.





Sept. 11

The roof. Putting up the metal roof panels was the worst part of the job for me. Just steep enough to make it slippery, so I screwed them all down from the top of the step ladder. Up & down a million times. Could've used a helper. But once it was on, I thought "It wouldn't be so hard to put a wall on. I could work from the ground." So here you can see the wall purlins, and I've framed in the windows and doors.





The walls. The side wall was pretty easy. All panels the same height. I bought a carbide-tooth metal-cutting skilsaw blade — made a lot of hot sparks but cut the panels easily.







Sept. 22

The front & rear panels were a lot more challenging. I made a template of hot-glued lath sticks for the top panel against the barn where it's all angles & notches. It worked. Needed a gutter – some of the fill was already washing away. I dug in a 4" PVC pipe to route the drain into the hedgerow. Pick & shovel– hard work for an old guy!



Sept 30

Finishing up. I cleaned up and installed some old windows from our house. They're at least 100 years old – one of them has wavy glass. I made some racks to store the extra boards, and put up some temporary lights. Covered over the rear door frame – garage doors will be next year. I've spent enough already!





October 6

It's done for this year. Made a door out of decking boards. Marlene likes it so much she wants one for the back door of the house! Trimmed out the door and windows and planted some grass. This started out as just a shed roof on the side of our barn. I think we had "mission creep." We're pretty happy with the results though. But I'm not sure if any of my cars will get a spot in the new space!





2024 MGCC WNY Motoring Challenge

I want to thank all of you who participated in the 2024 Motoring Challenge. I hope you all enjoyed searching for and finding the destinations, discovering new roads and areas of Western New York and beyond.

There were seventeen competitors trying to find 65 destinations with base points equaling 86 and 20+ bonus points totaling a minimum of 106 points if you reached every destination. Many of you are way beyond the 106 points (because of the possibility of multiple silos on destination #29), fighting for that first place position.

You have all sent me some very nice pictures depicting the destinations. I had to reject some destination photos from most of you (some more than once!) to meet the destination requirement. So, you may have argued with me, or secretly called me names, but I had to be tough in this fierce competition.

Here are some highlights from this year's Motoring Challenge. Who knew some of the hardest destinations to find would be #41 Cow Crossing Sign and #42 Bear Crossing Sign, followed by destinations #17 Cemetery Established in 1700s. We have many old cemeteries around, but many are not marked with dates. Next came the Covered Bridge #5 as there are not too many covered bridges left standing, but seven participants found three different bridges, the Newfield Cover Bridge, the Cannon Covered Bridge and Thomas Kelly Covered Bridge. Seven challengers found #21 Airport Control Tower (not Rochester's) well outside of the Rochester area.

We learned a lot about our New York state history and local history with the three NYS Blue and Yellow Historical Marker #8, 9, and 10. We saw the beautification of buildings with #16 Graffiti Art or Mural Painting on them. I was amazed seeing all the different Roadside Oddities #19 you came across, as well as #14 all the different kinds of Opera Houses, Play Houses and Theaters we have in our small towns, villages and cities. It's amazing how you just come upon #65, Three or more Destinations in one Picture, and lo and behold you received 5 bonus points. The destination that gave most of you the most points and put you in the fierce competition towards first place was #29 Barn with Silo, with one point for every silo over one in the same photo. Someone found a barn with 25 silos! I especially liked #18 Art Deco Building and if you researched this one you found out that Buffalo and the Buffalo area have the second most Art Deco buildings after New York City in our state.

But most of all, I liked the destination pictures that had multiple club members traveling together to find the destinations. That's what it's all about; common interests, friendships and having a good time.

Remember, awards will be given and place standings announced at the Holiday Party, December 7, 2024. If you are unable to attend, let me know ASAP so I can deliver your award to you prior to my leaving for California on November 9th.

Family Funster The MGB is a car corral staple, but this 1977

roadster, with subtle modifications, stood out

ven 44 years after the last examples rolled off the assembly line in Abingdon, the MGB remains the most visible, best-loved classic British sports car of all time. Hundreds of thousands of these reasonably priced two-seaters found homes in America through the model's 18-year run, and while many have been lost to attrition, a good portion remain on the road in fairweather use. It's not uncommon to find open-top MGBs for sale in car corrals like the one at New York's annual Rhinebeck Car Show. There were two late MGBs present during that event in May, and one really stood out.

It was a 1977 "Tourer" (A.K.A. convertible) model, one of 15,825 examples built for North America that model year. Our feature B wore burgundy paint that looked similar to MG Damask Red, with a black vinyl soft top and trunk-mounted luggage rack. This "rubber bumper" car turned heads thanks to distinctive 15-inch Panasport-style alloy wheels with gunmetal gray centers and machine-finished rims that were wrapped in 205/50-15 performance radials. That dark metallic gray color was echoed in slender twin racing stripes that ran over the center of the car, starting behind the MG octagon on the front bumper. This B also sported a pair of clear-lens headlamps with subtle LED rings that double as daytime running lights.

Inside, the car looked pleasingly stock with the correct vinyl seat upholstery and

four-spoke steering wheel; custom touches were limited to an MG-crest knob atop the four-speed manual shifter, a modern aftermarket CD stereo with door-panel speakers, and bright-metal sill plates. The six-dial dashboard design - new for this model year - included one alteration: it was retrofitted with a T-handle manual choke, indicating a change in the engine bay.

Lifting the B's bonnet revealed a clean and tidy-looking 1,800-cc B-series fourcylinder that, when it left the factory, had a single Zenith-Stromberg carburetor with an automatic choke. That power-robbing, if smog-compliant, carb had been replaced with a two-barrel Weber DGV downdraft unit. All the sheetmetal under the hood was a similar shade of red as the exterior body, but a bit of blue overspray on the VIN plate in the driver's door jamb indicated this car had once worn a very different paint color.

After the event concluded, I spoke with Doug Calli—this car's seller—to learn more about the MG and if it was successful in finding a new home. He told me it had been in his family for about 35 years, purchased by his father-in-law as fun runabout and later gifted to his wife. By the time it joined his household about 15 years ago, the 1977 MGB had lots of servicing documentation but was tired, with body and mechanical issues needing attention. Doug had a British sports car specialist firm go through it front to back, rebuilding the engine (which



was a replacement installed years earlier; the 23,912 miles showing on the odometer didn't reflect the car's true mileage) and repainting the body in a similar shade of burgundy as his father-in-law had chosen years earlier. It was Doug who'd added the wheels and other custom parts.

He said that the little roadster drove great and garnered a lot of positive attention, but it wasn't really his cup of tea and wasn't being used as much as it should. That's what prompted him to bring it to Rhinebeck with an asking price that—while dearer than the \$8,701 that classic.com reports are the average public sale price for a 1977 MGB and the \$12,304 the site assigns this model as a Classic Market Benchmark-reflected what J.D. Power considers "Average Retail." While the MGB received numerous compliments in the corral, it didn't sell that weekend. Happily, he reported, just a few days later it found a new local home for his full asking price.
